About the Course

Course Audience

Autism Navigator JumpStart to Coaching in Everyday Activities is a web-based course geared for interprofessional training for a variety of disciplines to support families of young children with or at risk for autism. It is designed to build the capacity of early intervention providers, community health workers, family navigators, home visitors, and early childhood teachers to coach families as they are learning in the *How-To Guide for Families*, so families can hit the ground running to support their child's learning in everyday activities.

Course Content

Autism Navigator JumpStart to Coaching in Everyday Activities is a self-paced course with 20 hours of online content that uses interactive slides with audio narration, closed captions, and illustrative video clips. This is an abridged or "lite" version of our *Autism Navigator for Early Intervention Providers – Knowledge and Skills* course. Also included are links to web resources, research briefs, supporting documents to support learning and application of the information, and documents to share with families. Autism Navigator courses use an unparalleled video library with more than two dozen different toddlers with autism and their families embedding intervention strategies and supports in their natural environment. The video clips illustrate core diagnostic features, key social communication milestones and early signs of ASD, how to gather and share information with families, evidence-based early intervention strategies and supports used by families of toddlers with autism in everyday activities, and ways to manage challenging behavior using positive behavior support. Each video player contains commentary that recaps key points and highlights critical behaviors.

The course includes the content of the **Autism Navigator How-To Guide for Families**, which is comprised of 4 Guide Books and 2 Video Libraries:

Guide Book 2: Collaborating to Make Early Intervention Work for You

The course also includes 2 Field Guides for interprofessional training on building consensus with families on the early signs of autism and coaching families on how to get started right away embedding evidence-based strategies into their everyday activities to support their child's learning and development.

Our e-learning platform includes a printed script of the content for each Guide Book and Field Guide that you can download. It also includes a Tools section that has print documents to support your learning and the families you are coaching. You can also complete a Learner Assessment with multiple-choice questions about information presented in each Guide Book and Field Guide, and then download or print a certificate of completion for each. Your Autism Navigator Jump Start certificate of completion can be used to claim continuing education units.

Pressed for time? We have developed the content to build across books, but you can decide which order you want to go through the books or the slides and video players within a book, and how much of the content you want to complete at any time.

Companion to the How-To Guide for Families

Professionals with an annual subscription to Autism Navigator courses receive seats in the How-To Guide for Families, a value of \$625 per seat, to invite families with a positive screen for autism who are ready to get started supporting their child's learning. While families can purchase the How-To Guide, the goal is that a provider on their care team can invite them to the course at no cost to the family.

This How-To Guide for Families will be instrumental for providers to use with families they serve in early intervention. It is designed as a companion course for families served by providers enrolled in the Autism Navigator Jumpstart to Coaching in Everyday Activities or the Autism Navigator for Early Intervention Providers. The content and video illustrations can educate families and help to maximize time for coaching during intervention sessions to improve outcomes of toddlers with ASD and their families. What You Will Learn from Autism Navigator® How-To Guide for Families
